In the Kazakh-German University (DKU) under the MA educational program "Integrated Water Resources Management" (IWRM) are trained: **11 MA students** in the first year of study, **7 MA students** in the second year of study. Total number of the MA students is **18**.

3. Number and thematic profile of teaching staff (full professors, associate professors, assistant professors, lecturers)

The main academic staff the IWRM MA program are professors of the flying faculty. Flying faculty professors teach more than 60% of all subjects in the IWRM MA program, which are included in the blocks of basic disciplines of the elective component and profile disciplines of the university component. The teaching of subjects by professors from Europe is the basis for the transfer of international experience in water management to MA students from Central Asia.

aid in solving water and environmental problems at all levels.

The program content is developed in collaboration with the Free University of Berlin (Freie Universität Berlin) having many years of experience in education in the field of Water Management including Central Asia.

Courses are conducted by professors from Freie Universität Berlin and experts from German and Central Asian organizations. Students actively participate in research projects and practical activities.

The "water diplomacy" subject is in the list of the elective component in IWRM. However, due to the limited funding for the teaching staff, the teaching of this subject is not carried out.

Yes, DKU is interested in inviting the guest lecturers. Most of the professors teaching IWRM MA program are the guest lecturers. They teach subjects such as Integrated Water Resources Management, Water and Climate Systems, Hydraulic Engineering, Project Planning, NEXUS, Water Gonernance and Cooperation, and others. The cost for accommodation, travel,

remuneration and others for the guest lecturers are paid by the DAAD project.
